## Professional Experience

### **GENERAL MUSIC TEACHER | LUIS MUÑOZ MARIN ELEMENTARY SCHOOL | AUGUST 2020 – PRESENT**

- I teach music classes for grades K-8, founded a before-school 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade band, and direct the music for the musical theater club. For each of these groups, I coordinate lesson plans with a co-teacher, budget for materials, and organize field trips, rehearsals, and performances. I also serve as secretary for the School Governance Council, which coordinates family events and serves as a bridge between the Parental Advisory Council and the school administration.

### **GENERAL MUSIC TEACHER | FOXBANK ELEMENTARY SCHOOL | JUNE 2018 – AUGUST 2020**

- I taught music classes for grades K-5, founded the district's first 5<sup>th</sup> grade band, and direct the after-school chorus and improvisation-based tech ensemble, leading them in performances at school and away locations. I directed the Cane Bay Middle School Jazz Band, assistant directed the Berkeley High School Marching Blue Brigade, and coordinated with the related arts team to organize and execute family events.

### **SAXOPHONIST | THE JOE CLARKE BIG BAND | FEBRUARY 2018 – MARCH 2020**

- I attended weekly rehearsals and performed in-house and at events on saxophone, clarinet, and flute. Over the summer of 2019, I helped renovate the interior of the new Forte Jazz Lounge, for which we became the house band. I was also a founding member of the Gatsby Orchestra, which specialized in early jazz music.

### **GENERAL MUSIC TEACHER | CANE BAY ELEMENTARY SCHOOL | AUGUST 2017 – JUNE 2018**

- I taught music classes for grades K-4, co-taught after-school chorus, and led that chorus in performance at school and away locations. I founded the Cane Bay Middle School Jazz Band, served as the Visual Tech for the Cane Bay High School Marching Cobras, and coordinated with the related arts team to organize and execute family events.

### **INTERIM BAND DIRECTOR | HERNDON HIGH SCHOOL | FEBRUARY 2017 – APRIL 2017**

- I directed the Symphonic Band, Wind Ensemble, and Percussion Ensemble, and taught AP Music Theory. I lead all ensembles to VA State Assessment, where they received high ratings, and coordinated with the color guard and indoor drumline for rehearsal space and performances at away venues.

### **PRIVATE WOODWIND INSTRUCTOR | MUSIC AND ARTS | MAY 2013 – MAY 2017**

- I taught one-on-one lessons to clarinet, saxophone, and flute students aged 8 to adulthood and organized studio recitals for them to perform in. Student curriculums were tailored to fit their individual needs and goals.

Fringe Festival in 2016. This plethora of teaching and performance experiences qualifies me to teach a broad range of performing arts subjects, and gives me unique perspective when collaborating with others in the department.
